

## Information on data processing in connection with the International Art Competition „When we meet we change the world - Spotkania kreują przyszłość” 2nd edition

### **Purpose and legal basis and period of personal data processing**

- Organization and promotion of the Competition „When we meet we change the world - Spotkania kreują przyszłość” 2nd edition on the terms described in the Regulations, in particular conducting the Competition, sending prizes and publishing competition works. The legal basis for data processing is the person's consent, which is expressed by completing the declaration constituting Annex 1 to the Regulations.
- Defense against possible claims related to the use of competition works by the Organizer, which is the legitimate interest of the administrator.

Data processing will take place for the period of exercising the organizer's rights to use the competition works, in accordance with the consent granted.

### **Data recipients**

- service providers entrusted with the processing of personal data by contract for the purposes of providing services to the data controller, in particular entities such as IT service providers - to the extent necessary for the proper performance of the ordered services

### **Voluntary provision of data**

Providing data is voluntary, but failure to provide it will result in the inability to participate in the Competition.

### **Rights related to the processing of personal data**

You have the right to:

- access to your data and the right to request their rectification, to limit data processing or to delete them ("right to be forgotten"),
- withdrawal of consent given voluntarily. Withdrawal of consent does not affect compliance with the right to data processing that was carried out before consent was withdrawn,
- to transfer personal data, i.e. to receive personal data, in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format,
- to object to data processing carried out on the basis of the legitimate interest of the administrator,
- to lodge a complaint with the President of the Personal Data Protection Office.
